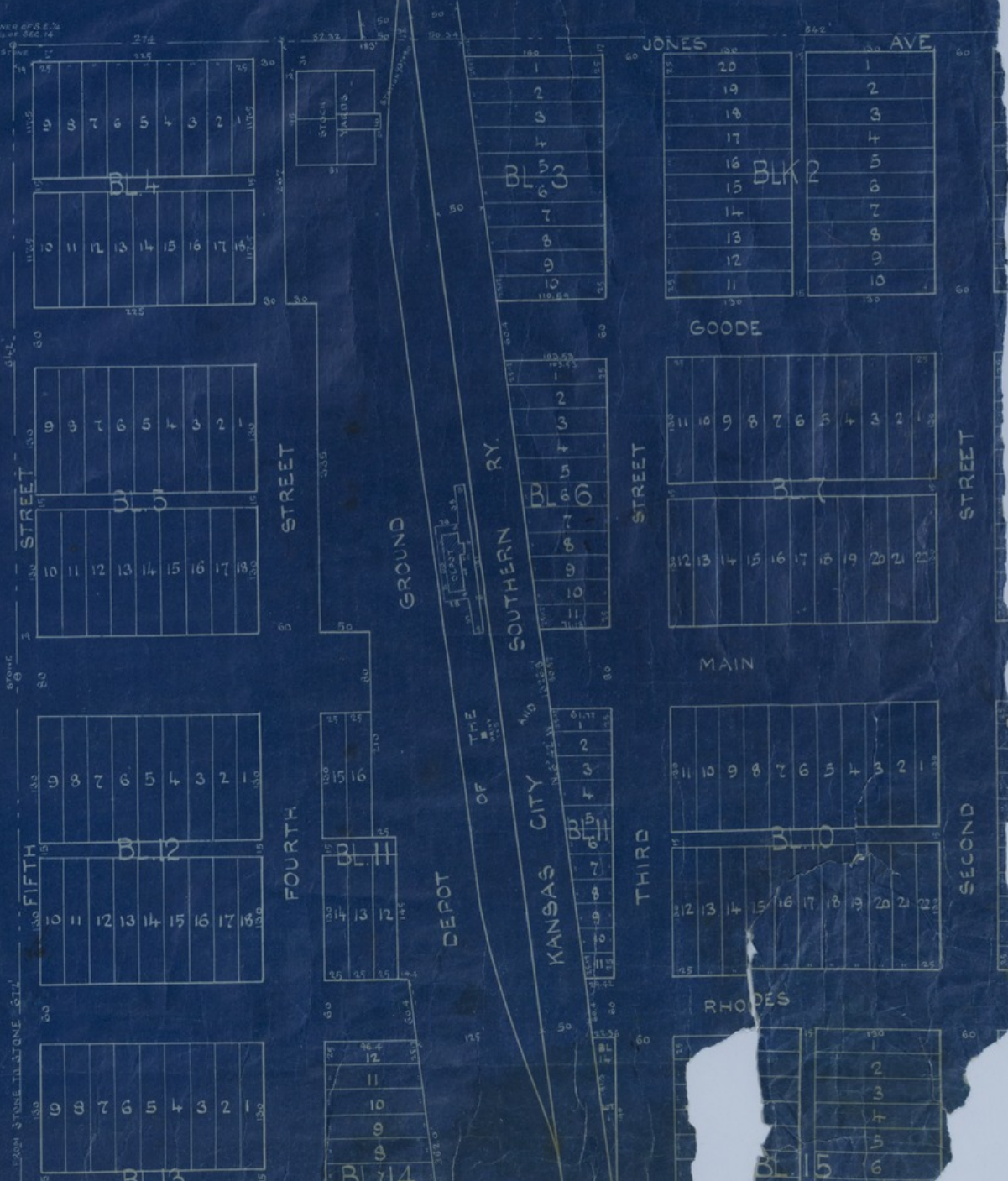

South 1514 ft. to point of Beginning.
