


1948 Campaign

In 1948 Harry Truman traveled more than 30,000 miles campaigning for the presidency. Many polls and newspapers predicted that he would lose to Republican candidate, Thomas Dewey. But Truman fooled the press by winning 28 states. When the votes were counted Truman received 24,179,347 votes and Dewey received 21,991,292. Truman's perseverance paid off, he won!
