February 11, 1943  
Mrs. Shipman writes to President Truman and expresses her disdain towards the War Relocation Authority's effort to educate Japanese-Americans.

December 7, 1941  
Attack on Pearl Harbor by the Japanese.

Feb, 1950  
-Truman addressed the 442nd Regiment  
July 15, 1946  
-Executive Order 9742  
June 25, 1946
